Recommendation #1: Branding of 501c3 vs. CoC for Administrative Functions

Business Situation:

- The 501c3 officially "owns" the brand name "Partners in Care"
- Partners in Care (501c3) is also the fiscal sponsor and official partner to the Continuum of Care (CoC) where PIC staff assists with carrying out the daily business on behalf of the CoC via the 501c3
- The transition from PIC as a CoC to PIC as a 501c3 has resulted in confusion + administrative challenges (ex: Laura recently needed to draft an MOU between PIC and PIC)
- Legally, the CoC does not need to have a formal name
- Clarity on the business naming will streamline grant applications, contracts, and essential business functions.

Committee Recommendation:

- Official 501c3 Name: Partners in Care, Oahu's Continuum of Care DBA Partners in Care
- Official CoC Name (for time being): Oahu CoC

Recommendation #2: Branding + Communications for Oahu CoC

Business Situation:

- Oahu CoC strategic planning retreat is considering Sharon Simms as its contractor
- Strategic planning was to originally include branding as part of the agenda and work

Committee Recommendation:



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- Based on best practices, it is recommended that branding and communications follows strategic planning retreat agenda items with focus on PIC reorganization only
- PIC Communications Committee to begin Oahu CoC brand conversations this year separately, and will consider Sharon Simms if needed at a later time
