Call to Order, Approval of Minutes	The meeting was called to order at 11:30am. Minutes from July 2022 were approved as written. Scott moved to accept minutes as reported. Jillian seconded.	July 2022 Planning meeting minutes approved.
Continuing Business	<p>Continuing Business</p> <p>NOFO – The regular NOFO is due this Friday. The Special NOFO for Unsheltered is due on October 20th. Big thank you out to the evaluators for reviewing and ranking the applications.</p> <p>Housing First Training</p> <p>Jillian is working on Housing First Training. She will be working on this before the end of the year. There will be some training at the November conference from Europe, but we also want to make sure that we have a Hawaii specific training.</p> <p>Monitoring and evaluation. Laura reviewed the monitoring dashboards that will be sent out with a financial report on a quarterly basis. There are some questions regarding the CES referrals section of the dashboards.</p>	
New Business	<p>Supportive housing Workgroup: Cheryl updated the group on a stakeholder group focused on supportive housing. Rep Nakamura has been working on legislation to support more supportive housing. We have had special presentations to help understand different programs and getting housing choice vouchers paired with programs. We had some speakers from Portland Oregon and Los Angeles to talk about their legislative work that they have done around this topic. Review on the work that Lindsey did for the State Housing and Homelessness office. She worked on a review of programs that have been working well and the</p>
