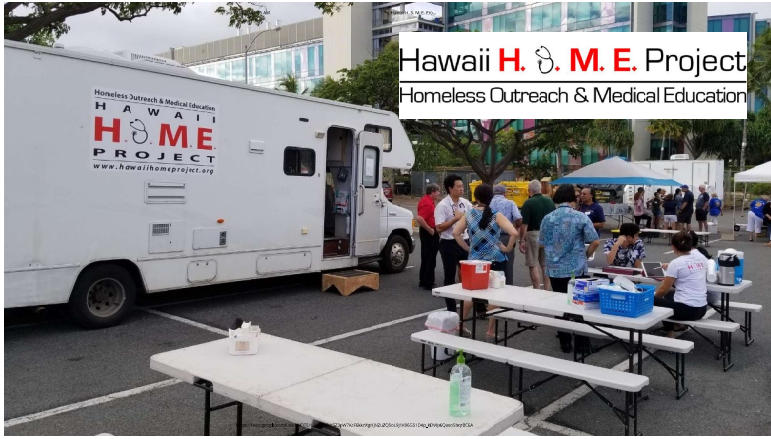

INTENTIONS WITH HMIS



- Document clients needs and assess service outcomes
- Increase communication amongst other organizations to improve collaboration with partners
- Support other organizations that use HMIS with patient/client care needs
- Place to store vital documents into HMIS when patient's consent is given
- Further support patients with coordinating services

IMPLICATION OF HMIS (IF APPROVED)

Training

- Home Project staff will be asked to attend a mandatory HMIS training to learn safety protocols and any HMIS related procedures within the system (Training every Friday 1-3pm)
- Will not implicate HMIS system until ALL staff is trained

Operation at Clinic

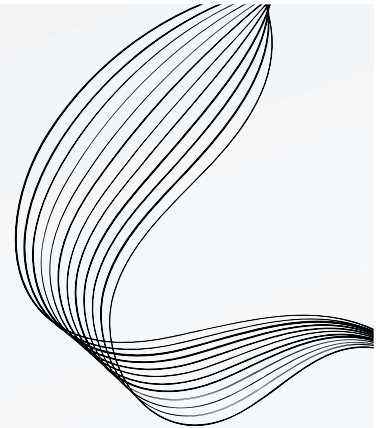
- Staff will be trained to look up patients in HMIS system when patients enter clinic
- HMIS system will be used as a primary source for staff to input and address client needs (client goals, past medical appointments, client service outcomes.)
- Staff will use HMIS system to assist other organizations

Maintenance

- Logistics Coordinator (Hunter) will be responsible for maintenance of HMIS system ensuring all HMIS privacy and HMIS protocols are followed

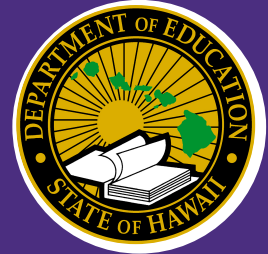

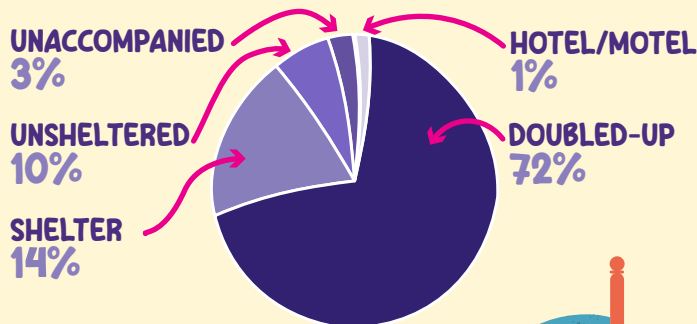

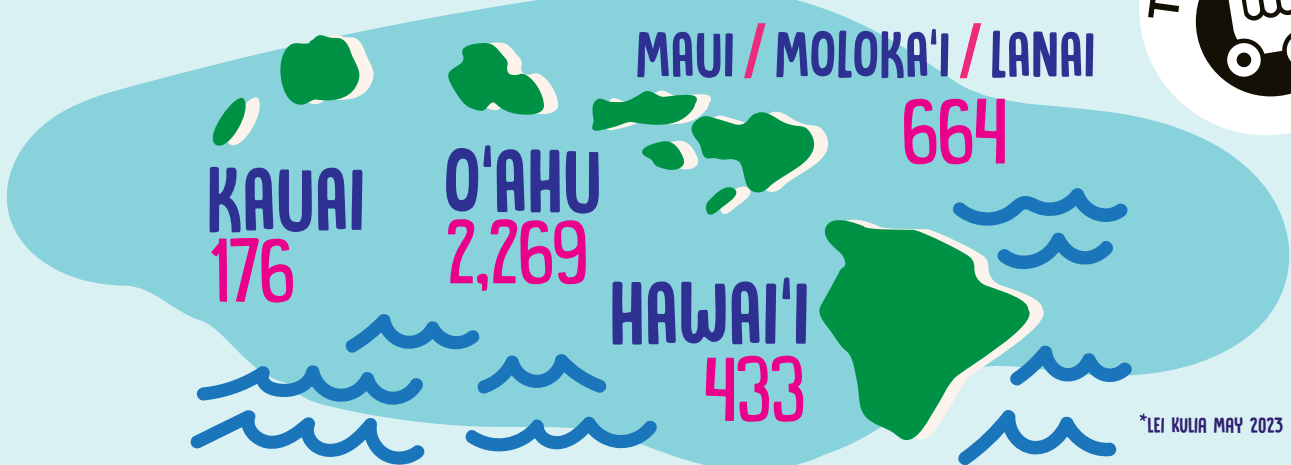
