On the Job Training (OJT) & Internship Program

- For eligible participants
- An employee of the organization from the first day of OJT
- Six weeks to six months of subsidized employment; depending on difficulty of skills to be learned
- Internship - four weeks long. Employer/employee evaluate relationship to determine whether it's a fit

Dislocated Worker- laid off or notified of layoff and unlikely to return to that occupation

Income Eligibility -Under 70% or 225% of LLSIL

An individual with a certified disability - family of one





Training

- For eligible participants
- Eligible Training Provider List
- Up to \$4000 in tuition assistance
- Additional funds for supportive services such as books, tools, uniforms, and supplies

Ticket to Work

Eligibility: Those ages 18-64 collecting Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and/or Supplemental Security Income (SSI).

Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP)

- ▶ Work based training program for those 55 years or older

Disabled Veteran Outreach Program (DVOP)

1. A Special Disabled or Disabled Veteran
2. A Homeless Veteran; expanded to include domestic violence and other dangerous or life-threatening conditions.
3. A Recently-Separated Service member who has been unemployed for 27 or more weeks in the previous 12 months.
4. A Veteran Offender who is currently incarcerated or has been released from incarceration.
5. A Veteran who is lacking a high school diploma or equivalent certificate.
6. A Low-Income Veteran (as defined by WIOA Section 3 (36))
7. A Veteran who is between the ages of 18 to 24 years old.
8. Member of the Armed Forces, who is Wounded, Ill or Injured and receiving treatment in a military facility or in a Warrior Transition Unit (MTFs/WTU). A. Family Caregivers of such Wounded, Ill or Injured Service Members.
9. Transitioning Service Members (including eligible National Guard and Reserve members being separated or discharged from active duty, in need of Intensive Services.
10. Vietnam Era Veterans
