Uses or Disclosures to Avert a Serious Threat to Health or Safety

45 CFR 164.512(j)

A HIPAA-covered entity <u>may</u> use or disclose protected health information based on a <u>good faith belief</u> that (1) it is necessary to <u>prevent or lessen a serious and imminent threat</u> to the health or safety of the individual or others, and (2) it is to a person or persons reasonably able to prevent or lessen the threat, including the target of the threat. [512(j)(1)(i); emphasis added]

A covered entity is presumed to have acted on a good faith belief if that belief was the result of the covered entity's actual knowledge or because the covered entity was relying on a credible representation by a person with apparent knowledge or authority. [512(j)(4)]
