2019 POINT IN TIME COUNT OAHU AND STATEWIDE NUMBERS



OAHU OVERVIEW

Results from the 2019 Oahu Point In Time (PIT) Count revealed the following information:

- **A 1 percent overall decrease in the number of homeless individuals, from 4,495 persons in 2018 to 4,453 persons in 2019**
 - **A 13 percent decrease in sheltered homeless individuals (2,350 persons in 2018 to 2,052 persons in 2019)**
 - **A 12 percent increase in unsheltered homeless individuals (2,145 persons in 2018 to 2,401 persons in 2019)**
- **A 5 percent decrease in the total number of sheltered and unsheltered homeless veterans compared with 2018**
- **A 1 percent increase in the total number of chronically homeless individuals and persons in chronically homeless families compared with 2018**
- **A 15 percent decrease in the total number of people in homeless families compared with 2018**



STATEWIDE OVERVIEW

Combined results from Hawaii's two Continua of Care, Partners in Care (Oahu) and Bridging the Gap (Neighbor Islands), revealed the following information:

- **A 1 percent overall decrease statewide in the number of homeless individuals, from 6,530 persons in 2018 to 6,448 persons in 2019.**
 - **An 8 percent decrease in sheltered homeless individuals (3,055 persons in 2018 to 2,810 persons in 2019)**
 - **A 5 percent increase in unsheltered homeless individuals (3,475 persons in 2018 to 3,638 persons in 2019)**
- **A 5 percent decrease in the total number of sheltered and unsheltered homeless veterans statewide compared with 2018**
- **A 3 percent increase statewide in the total number of chronic homeless individuals and persons in chronically homeless families, compared with 2018**
- **A 15 percent decrease in the total number of people in homeless families compared with 2018**

The statewide decrease featured overall decreases on Hawaii (21 percent), Oahu (1 percent), and Maui (1 percent). However, there was a 51 percent increase in total homelessness on Kauai.
