### PIC Advocacy Meeting July 11, 2017 MINUTES

Approval of Minutes	Correction: Gavin and Carla should only be noted as present once. Under New Business, the spelling of Natalie's name should be corrected – one "l."	<b>Approved with corrections</b>
PIC Advocacy Survey Follow Up	The survey was circulated at the last general meeting and sent out electronically. Gavin reported that we received no online responses. Natalie will send out again, with a deadline (one week from distribution – approximately 7/19). She will also send a reminder the day before the due date. Following, Hawaii Appleseed will do the data entry and a bit of data analysis by 7/28. The committee or a smaller work group will then form recommendations of priority areas which will be presented to the Board of Directors.	
Summer Advocacy Summer Activity and Data Follow Up	<p>The committee reviewed data collection list formulated at the last meeting. Jen reported that PIC support will be providing district level PIT data for legislative meetings that highlight the PIT data in respective districts. Gavin offered to provide staffing support to create dashboards, flowcharts and logic models. Jen reported that PIC staffing would have draft dashboards available by early August.</p> <p>Natalie reported on the need for a follow up meeting with HHFDC (Rental House Revolving Fund). We have requested information from HHFDC about how other states use their RHRF. Janet from HHFDC is our contact.</p> <p>Judith suggested that PIC membership mobilize around October 13 Children and Youth Summit, and make sure all youth served are in attendance. At this meeting, legislative priorities for youth will be decided for the 2018 session.</p>	

GIA Update	Judith reported that HYSN received a letter from the State explaining that GIA funds (expected award date July or August) will not be granted due to lower tax revenue than expected. All GIA grants will be delayed until December, and may not be funded at all. Members expressed concern about the rest of the state budget.
